

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

On **July 15, 2026**, **WILLOW SPRINGS MHP 2 & 3** collected drinking water samples and tested them for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). PFAS are a group of human-made chemicals that have been used since the 1950s.

Based on these sample results, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is requiring **WILLOW SPRINGS MHP 2 & 3** to issue a Tier 2 Public Notice in accordance with s. NR 809.950(3)(c)5., Wis. Adm. Code. PFAS chemicals have been detected in the drinking water supplied by **WILLOW SPRINGS MHP 2 & 3** at concentrations exceeding the running annual average (RAA) of one or more maximum contaminant levels (MCLs) established under s. NR 809.224(1)(d), Wis. Adm. Code. These results will not result in the issuance of an MCL violation at this time (s. NR 809.22(2)(c) Wis. Adm. Code). However, if the RAA continues to exceed the applicable MCL after April 26, 2029, the system will be issued a violation.

Potential Health Risks of PFAS

Long-term exposure to PFAS in drinking water at concentrations above the applicable maximum contaminant levels may increase the risk of adverse health effects, including impacts on the immune system, liver, thyroid, cardiovascular system, cholesterol levels, and development during pregnancy and childhood. Certain PFAS have also been associated with an increased risk of specific cancers.

People can consider alternative water sources such as:

- Water from other sources that have been tested and do not exceed recommended standards
- Filtered water from a pitcher, sink, or whole-house filter system with a certified filter technology. A granular activated carbon (GAC) filter that meets ANSI/NSF Standard 53 or a reverse osmosis (RO) filter with an included GAC component can filter out PFAS. - Boiling water does not remove PFAS.

What is being done to correct the problem?

The **WILLOW SPRINGS MHP 2 & 3** has taken proactive steps to protect public health, including:

We are working with the Village of Lisbon to connect the Willow Springs MHP 2 & 3 to the public water supply of an adjoining municipality.

How are people exposed to PFAS?

The primary way people are exposed to PFAS is through drinking water or eating contaminated food. PFAS are not readily absorbed through the skin, so contact with PFAS-containing water (such as bathing or washing) poses very low health risk.

What are per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS)?

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a large group of human-made chemicals that resist heat, water, and oil. They have been used in industrial processes and consumer products such as carpeting, waterproof clothing, upholstery, food packaging, personal care products, firefighting foam, and metal plating.

PFAS are widespread in the environment and have been detected at low levels in the bloodstream of the general U.S. population.

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How does PFAS get into drinking water?

PFAS can enter drinking water through industrial use and disposal, spills or releases to soil and water, runoff into lakes and rivers, and air deposition. These chemicals move easily through soil into groundwater and can contaminate drinking water sources.

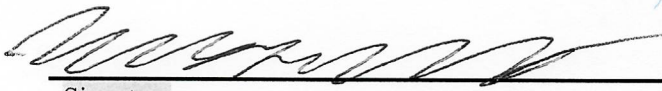
